AFFAIRS OF THE DISTRICT.

A Petition Concerning Party Wall Damages Denied.

The Commissioners Asked to Set Apart a Day for Special Prayer for the President's Recovery—Will Decline to Remit Bank Penalties.

James Corridon, of 912 First Street northwest, recently filed a complaint in behalf of his sister, Johanna L. Corridon, against the actions of the late James T. Fitzgerald, a policeman of the Metropolitan Police Force, asking the Commissioners to restore to her the cost of certain damages to her property.

Mr. Corridon submits a long statement giving the history of the several improvements made by Fitzgerald on his lot and recounting the manner in which the lowering of the grade of the lot determined Miss Corridon's property.

It is asserted in the office of the Inspector of Buildings that these repairs were made, and that, therefore, the District government cannot be held liable for the damage set forth by Mr. Corridon in his letter.

The Brotherhood of American Yeomen, of Des Moines, Iowa, has applied for permission to do business in the District of Columbia as a fraternal beneficial association.

Thomas J. Looker has addressed the Commissioners relative to the setting apart of a day of special prayer for the recovery of President McKinley from the wounds inflicted at Buffalo, N.Y.

The Computing Engineer has forwarded to the Commissioners a schedule of proposals for the improvement of Connecticut Avenue west of Rock Creek.

It is understood that the District Commissioners will approve the recommendation of the Assessor in the case of the Traders National Bank, which requested the remission of penalties and interest for the second half tax for 1901 against part of lot 12, square 554.

A similar report was made by the Assessor on the application of the Committee of Vestry of St. Stephen's Protestant Episcopal parish for the remission of the interest and penalties for the second half of 1901 on lots 12 and 13, block 35, Columbia Heights.

Alexander H. Brooks, of 204 Seventh Street northwest, has written to the Engineer Commissioner, in reply to his letter, relative to the removal of the street washer in front of the house named.

The letter was referred to the surface division and C. B. Hunt, the Computing Engineer, has reported that it is the practice of his office to remove defective street washers when laying new sidewalks.
