GEN. HEYWOOD'S REPORT.

The Annual Statement of the United States Marine Corps.

An Account of the Part Taken in the Funeral Obituaries at President McKinley—Philippine and Chinese Troubles Referred to at Length.

The annual report of Brig. Gen. Charles Heywood, Commandant of the Marine Corps, to the Secretary of the Navy was made public today. The report contains some information of local interest, and a recapitulation of the work of the corps in the Philippines and China.

Brigadier General Heywood recommends that the rank of the commandant of the Marine Corps be raised from brigadier general to major general, although he does so with diffidence, he says, as such action would result in his own promotion.

The present authorized strength of the Marine Corps being 4,823 men, it is estimated that its commandant is clearly entitled to the rank of major general, even on the single basis that the commandant of the Army has been given the rank of major general since the passage of the Navy Department act of March 2, 1899.
