DEATH DUE TO HIS OWN FAULT.

The Evening Times

Officials Say Cox's Injuries Were Incurred by Negligence.

MONDAY, DECEMBER 16, 1901.

The officials of the Soldiers' Home allege that the death of Charles Cox was due to his own negligence. Had he complied with the regulations governing the Home, they say, he would not have been in the portion of the building where the accident occurred.

PUBLICATION OFFICE: CORNER TENTH AND D STREETS.

Cox had but recently been released from the hospital, where he had undergone an operation for double hernia. This had left him in a greatly weakened condition. Sunday morning he returned to the Home somewhat the worse for drink and wandered into the basement, where he succeeded in getting into the elevator cage.

The Weather Indications.

He was first struck on the head by the descending counterweight and afterwards crushed by the car itself. It was believed that he had been under the car fifteen minutes before he was discovered.

Lewis T. Leech, the elevator conductor, another inmate of the Home, is locked up awaiting the investigation by the coroner. It is not believed that he is in any way to blame for the accident, and only a charge of "drunk" appears against his name.
