The crap-shooters were the only ones whom he failed to suppress on the following Sunday, and yesterday he determined to give them a lesson. And about 2 o'clock, accompanied by four of his deputies, he went to Royston, and raided the games that were in progress on the tables in that vicinity.

The presence of Sheriff Palmer in the vicinity of Royston also had a salutary effect on the saloons and gambling houses. All were tightly closed up, and there was a marked absence of that drunkenness and disorder which characterized the Sabbath day when Welch was sheriff.
