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Federation of Girl Bachelors

CLUB FOR BUYING "BACHELOR" SUPPLIES WHOLESALE.

The Members Give Financial Security and Get Things of a Pretty "President."

New York, Oct. 26.—There is no New York club calling itself by the imposing title of "The Federation of Girl Bachelors' Clubs."

These days of benevolent associations and aid societies and working girls' helps of all kinds, the mention of financial security comes hardly upon the ear...

The Federation Club is a union of girls' clubs for the purpose of securing for the individual members household and dress supplies at prices less than retail.

The president of the Federation Club is a very pretty girl bachelor. She is not a member of any other club, and put in her claim to membership on the ground that she liked to keep house, but couldn't quite afford it at retail prices...

One of our apartment houses, filled with girl bachelors in hard luck, has a laundry underneath, and we conduct our own laundry work, taking in a little outside work.

"Are we all poor?" smiled the president, sitting her pretty nose and settling down into the cushion of her own luxurious divan.

"Now, you are going to ask if we have any other role for admission. References, church certificates or anything of that kind. And I can tell you that there are none. It is managed like a man's club.

"What is your financial security?" I asked. "The club would be a designing firm. I get \$40 a week and am engaged by contract for a year."

"You are eligible and I, and I will send you a list for you to see the apartment and such things as you want to rent. You will have to chip in on your share of my rent for managing you. It will be about 25 cents."

"She was delighted, and from her orders she is spending her full \$40 a week upon her good things. But that's her business, not mine, and by the way, there are fifty young girls of old-fashioned ways who get two gallons of ice cream to night, and eight others want a gallon each. I got it for 20 cents a quart."

"Laying one's hand on a desirable thing opened at the first page: 'There is our bread and roll list, you see.' Said she: 'We order 100 loaves of bread a day and 200 rolls. One baker has our orders and delivers at a little above wholesale to the members in their apartments every morning. I pay the baker and the members pay me. That is why we have to be so particular about financial references.'

"With our milk we do the same, also with our tea, coffee and the staples. We also buy our groceries at wholesale. I have orders for twenty roasts of beef every Sunday and 100 loaves. I get them cheap, and my agent selects the one to send in to me. We cannot take individual orders, only standing ones, and so we get them at wholesale."

"About our household linen, towels, sheets, etc., we have a market also. We hire them made and stored at a certain store and we get them at hotel prices. There is quite a rebate. I pay cash on delivery, and the shopkeeper has them carried to the different apartments all over the city. See? Here is an order from

There are about twenty children whose parents belong to the Knickerbocker Skating Club of New York. This club is composed of society people from all over the country.

There is a clubhouse and employed in and out of the building are many professional laborers who keep it in skating perfection. A professional skating rink manager from Montreal superintends it.

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
