NEEDS OF THE NAVY YARD

Commodore Mathews' Annual Report Submitted to the Secretary.

Roof of the Quadrangle Building Restored on Wooden Trusses, Which Are Rotting Away.

The annual report of Commodore E. O. Mathews, chief of the Bureau of Yards and Docks, was today submitted.

Relative to the navy yard in this city, he said that the roof of the quadrangle building now rests on 700 oak trusses, which are gradually rotting away, and in the near future it will be necessary to put on a new roof.

True economy requires the substitution of steel trusses now and putting on a new steel roof \$200,000.

In order to comply with the needs of the navy yard, the upper floor of the east end of the west side of the quadrangle building should be removed, the lower floor of the building, the upper floor of the west side, and general repairs made to this part of the building, \$1,000,000.
