London, Nov. 2.—Prime Minister Salisbury has handed over to the Right Hon. Joseph Chamberlain, a memorandum transmitted to him by the United States government through Ambassador Bayard relative to the Hawaiian question. Mr. Chamberlain still holds the opinion that the United States has no right to interfere in Great Britain's dispute with Venezuela, but he will draft a detailed reply to the memorandum, which Lord Salisbury will shortly send to Mr. Bayard.

When Wilcox found this disclosure, he had discovered he feared that his wife would leave him and denounce him. He therefore left her under lock and key and ill-treated her in other ways.
