TO MEET HERE NEXT YEAR, National Board of Trade Concludes and Adjourns.

The National Board of Trade, at its closing session yesterday, by a unanimous vote, directed the president of the board to send a peace message to the Associated Chamber of Commerce at London, England.

The report from the committee on transportation was adopted, deprecating government ownership of railroads, but advocating a strict supervision over their operation and management.

Mr. Wm. E. Tucker of Philadelphia, was elected secretary and treasurer to succeed the late Hamilton Andrews Hills, and the board adjourned to meet here again next year.




Fig. 1, Fig. 2.
