Let the Knights of Labor Journal Publish Sense.

Fixed income, bonds, mortgages, and money in all its forms, whether in savings banks or national banks would have much less purchasing power and for precisely that reason we advocate free coinage and thereby an increased volume of money...

The above paragraph from the official organ of the Knights of Labor clearly indicates its worthlessness as a friend to wage-earners. The Journal has freely denounced everybody who stands for honest money...

The Journal is not a true friend of labor when it advocates free coinage, because such a policy debases money. The greater purchasing power we give to money the better it is for wage-earners.

As another illustration, take the report just published by Mr. Frederic Emery, chief of the Bureau of Statistics, on the currency systems of the different nations and their relation to prices and wages.

American labor would not fall to the level of the wage-earners of Mexico and other silver standard countries if Mr. Bryan were elected, but the purchasing power of wages would be diminished by the increased cost of living.

Which shows the metal most favored? The largest amount of specie our monetary system ever held under free coinage was in 1860, when \$271,605,225 were reported.

American wage-earners have certainly lost their senses if such men as those at the head of the Knights of Labor are fair representatives. The ranting of a lunatic or the silly mouthings of a fool are always excusable...

It would precipitate a panic such as has never before been experienced. Business enterprises on every side would go to the wall. Money could not be had at any rate of interest...
