Extract from the act of Congress of 3d March, 1845, section 18.

And be it further enacted, That it shall be the duty of the Postmaster General, in all future lettings of contracts for the transportation of the mail, to let the same, in every case, to the lowest bidder...

Bidders will be careful to read the forms and instructions appended to this advertisement. They are requested to state, in their proposals, the mode by which they intend to convey the mail...

Proposals for carrying the mails of the United States from the 1st day of July, 1850, to the 30th of June, 1851, inclusive, in Tennessee, will be received at the contract office of the Post Office Department...

5301 From Nashville at 8 p m tri-weekly, Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. By Green Hill, Cedar Grove, Lebanon, Three Forks, Alexandria, Liberty and Sligo...

By Springfield, Turnersville, and Post Royal; To Clarksville, by 8 p m, same days, 42 miles; And back between 6 a m and 8 p m, Tuesdays and Fridays...

By Grassy Cove and Cross Keys; To Ten Mile Stand by 5 p m same day, 39 miles; And back between 6 a m and 5 p m Tuesday...

By Straight Fork, Buffalo Creek, & Ponch Creek; To Whitley C. H., Kentucky, by 6 p m same day, 33 miles; And back between 7 a m and 6 p m every other Thursday...

To Franklin, N. C., by 6 p m Wednesday, 94 miles; And back between 6 a m Thursday and 6 p m Saturday...
