Wheat.

There is no advance in the price of wheat, though there is more offering at quotation figures—1.00 for white and 90 cents for red.—The largest and best lots are still in the hands of the farmers. We learn that a sale of 3,300 bushels of white was made at Dalton, Georgia, a few days ago at \$1.00. At Augusta last week there was a temporary advance of 5 cents per bushel. The Georgia Mills are said to be all short of both grain and flour, and are awaiting the movement of the western crop. Louisville quotes at 95¢ sack, Nashville 95¢ sack—the latter for fancy.
