Proceedings of the Legislature—A Fair Amount of Routine Business Transacted.

The Agricultural Lien Law Discussed in the House of Representatives—In the Senate.

JACKSON, MISS., January 27.—Senate.—Bills and resolutions passed: Supplemental to the act approved yesterday by the Governor incorporating the Memphis, Birmingham and Atlantic railroad.

The defense claim that they have clearly proved an alibi for Chyo Chigek.

A bill to facilitate the construction of the Gulf and Ship Island railroad was introduced and referred. It amends the law authorizing the transfer of the care of the penitentiary to said road and gives the company the right to use the convicts until the 1st of January, 1887, and authorizes the subletting or hiring out of such convicts as cannot be employed on the road to other roads and levee boards or private individuals in this State, provided one-half of all able-bodied convicts are kept at work continuously on the road; and requires the company to carry on and maintain the penitentiary.

The repeal of the agricultural lien law has been under discussion all the morning, pending which the House adjourned until 7:30 p.m.

BRUTAL TREATMENT Of a Shipwrecked Crew by Mexican Customs Officers.

NEW YORK, January 27.—A Galveston special to the Times says: Among the passengers on the steamship Harlan, from Vera Cruz to-day, was Capt. J. Lawrence of the British bark Eilat. He brings information that his vessel was lost on the Mexican coast, fifty-five miles east of Manatlan, on the 14th of last December. The Eilat was a Nova Scotia bark of 298 tons burthen, built at Pictou and valued at \$25,000. She sailed from Annapolis November 19th in ballast for Manatlan. Capt. Lawrence says that on the night of December 13th, about 11 o'clock, a fearful gale struck the ship. They were in sight of land. The storm raged all night with intense fury. All though both anchors were down, the vessel was driven back, the masts were like corks. Her masts were stripped of every vestige of sails and rigging, and at 5 o'clock next morning she was driven ashore. The disaster occurred within four miles of the town of Tonala, on a barren coast, with no facilities for getting the ship off. The captain says his crew was treated in a most brutal and heartless manner by the Mexican customs officials. During their efforts of several days to get the ship off, these officials came out, took all the food and clothing in the ship, and dealt out hard tacks without meat. The crew refused to eat, and went on longer, and the captain said the vessel at auction for \$50, but not one dollar of the proceeds ever reached him. The auctioneer and customs officials divided the spoils. The captain declares that he saw customs inspectors running about wearing uniforms and carrying stockings belonging to himself and his crew. He has complained to the British Consul at Vera Cruz, who will report the matter to his government.

The Irish Press Jubilant Over the Conservative Defeat—Meeting of the Cabinet.

LONDON, January 27.—The defeat of the government last night has left all the political parties in the House of Commons in a state of chaos and may result in a dissolution of Parliament and an appeal to the country.

Mr. Gladstone held a conference this afternoon with Lord Granville in relation to the resumption of office by the Liberals.

The crisis excites but little interest among the general public. Everything quiet and the commercial and financial markets but slightly weaker.

The meeting of the Cabinet to-day lasted an hour. The situation was fully discussed and it was resolved that the Ministers should at once resign.

The Marquis of Salisbury sent a special messenger to Osborne to inform the Queen of the decision of the Cabinet.

THE "GAZETTE'S" COMMENTS. The Pall Mall Gazette comments on the fact that the official record shows that Lord Hartington and Mr. Goschen, both Liberals, voted with the government in the division last night on Mr. Coling's land allotment amendment, and declares that their desertion of the Liberals in the division completely debars the Queen from intrusting either of them with the work of forming a new Ministry.

The Gazette further says that Lord Hartington may possibly retire to private life. The Conservatives rely upon divisions in the Liberal ranks to prevent Mr. Gladstone from forming a durable Cabinet.

Yesterday a warrant was issued for the arrest of Jean Perrault, charged with choking and maltreating a Frenchman, saying at the same time, "I degre, that the man died. Several witnesses testify that Perrault had lifted the man up by the neck and had thrown him rudely upon the bed. A paragraph from the evidence of Mrs. Charrette reads thus: "About one hour before his death I heard Perrault asking to go to the stairs. Some time before Frazier had said to Perrault: "Woe to you if I recover." In the course of the morning Frazier wanted to get up, when Perrault tied him to the bed with a cord, and in so doing put his knee on the suffering man's chest, saying at the same time, "If you stir I will hang you." The affair causes much excitement.
