

FINANCE AND COMMERCE.

Money in good demand at 8 per cent. Local securities firm. Taxing District 6's are now held at par. The cotton market yesterday was quiet and depressed, influenced by the apparently demoralized condition of the Liverpool market, which closed 3 1/4 lower than Friday on future deliveries; January, 45-64. Liverpool spots were reported quiet and unchanged; middling, 5d. The sales in this market yesterday were 1350 bales on a basis of 8 1/2 for middling; receipts, 858 bales; stock, 141,110 bales. The New York spot market opened steady and closed steady, middling, 9 3/16; futures steady, February, 9.07@9.08c. At New Orleans spots opened weak and closed dull at revised quotations, all grades below middling being marked down 1-1/16 except ordinary, which declined 3/16, to 7 1/2c. New Orleans futures were steady, February, 8.79@8.80c. Receipts at all United States ports yesterday, 20,219 bales. In general trade no change is reported except an advance in mess pork, which now rules at \$10 7/16 for old and \$11 7/16 for new. Other hog products are also a shade higher.
