The Company Stores Will Remain in the River Mines.

THE WORKMEN ASK FOR THEM.

One Establishment Which is Offered for Sale Very Cheap.

THE ROLL TURNERS' SCALE SETTLED.

There will not be much of a fight against company stores at the leading Monongahela river coal works for the reason that the operators claim they are an advantage to the miners.

THE DEBTS INCURRED by our employees are deducted from their pay. We started out of our river mines weeks ago, and to show that the men were not 'plucked,' we paid out \$2,000 in cash to 250 men to-day, after deducting their store bills and rent for their houses.

Several other river operators who were seen voted the views of those quoted above, but they admitted that some of the operators compelled their employees to deal at their stores, and charged them exorbitant prices for an inferior quality of goods.




