Section 1—It is hereby ordered and enacted by the authority of the same, that the grade of the south curb of Greenback street, from Wyoming street to Boggs avenue, be established as follows, to-wit: From the grade of the south curb of Greenback street at Wyoming street, to a point on the south curb of Greenback street, at an elevation of 42.5 feet; thence rising at the rate of 12 feet per 100 feet to a point on the south curb of Greenback street, at an elevation of 54.5 feet; thence rising at the rate of 6 feet per 100 feet to a point on the south curb of Greenback street, at an elevation of 60.5 feet; thence falling at the rate of 6 feet per 100 feet to a point on the south curb of Greenback street, at an elevation of 54.5 feet.
