

TO SEE THE ECLIPSE. The New Cruiser Baltimore Will Probably be Used by the GOVERNMENT SCIENTIFIC PARTY In Its African Expedition in Search of Solar Wonders.

PROFESSOR TODD WILL BE IN CHARGE. Any Number of Learned Savants Enrolled Among the Volunteers.

Arrangements are now made for the expedition of American scientists who will go to Africa to witness the great eclipse in December. It will be fully equipped in every respect. October 1 is set as the probable date of departure.

It is hoped that the new ship-of-war Baltimore, which is undergoing her first tests, will prove satisfactory and be placed at the disposal of the total eclipse expedition.

ALL WILLING TO GO. In regard to the composition of his staff, Prof. Todd is in correspondence with astronomical experts all over the country, as well as with leading men in other scientific walks.

AN OLD POINT RAISED AGAIN. There will be a dispute over the dynamite cruiser Vesuvius.
