

KNOWING THE GRAVE. Scenes and Incidents at the Funeral of the Late Capt. W. R. Jones.

A CORTEGE OF OVER 4,000 PERSONS. Workmen, Millionaires and Military Dignitaries Attend.

THE MAGNIFICENT FLORAL TRIBUTES. President and Catholic Clergy Both Officiate at the Funeral.

There has not been in many years a larger funeral about Western Pennsylvania than that of the late Captain W. R. Jones at Braddock yesterday.

The remains of the late Captain William R. Jones, General Manager of the Edgar Forman Steel Works at Braddock, were laid in their temporary resting place, in the Mills vault, Monongahela Cemetery, yesterday afternoon.

At 12:30 o'clock the employees of the steel works, wearing mourning emblems and white gloves, headed by the marshals, Messrs. M. Killen and John Hutchinson, drew up in column on Main street, awaiting the arrival of the cortege.

At the house of G. A. Post 8 furnished a grand and beautiful reception. Relatives and friends were assembled, scattered about the prettily kept grounds, and in the parlors. Shortly before 2 o'clock the head of the column of employees arrived at the funeral home.

Thousands of roses, lilies of the valley, carnations and other flowers were used, and forming in deep rows up through the entrance to view the remains which were enclosed in an elaborate casket completely enveloped in crepe and black silk drapings.

WONDERFUL FLORAL TRIBUTES. The floral tributes were of a most magnificent character, and were arranged in a most artistic and beautiful manner.

There were also many beautiful floral tributes from the various churches and societies of the city, and from the friends of the deceased.

At 2:30 o'clock the funeral service was held in the parlors of the funeral home. The Rev. Father Hickey officiated at the funeral, and the Catholic clergy also participated.

There is a vast multitude of people from every where in life who, with fearful eyes and trembling lips, join in saying, "He was my friend."

PROMINENT PEOPLE PRESENT. Rev. Father spoke of his early association with Captain Jones, and paid a glowing tribute to his memory.

AMONG THOSE PRESENT WERE: Judge Hankins, of the Orphans' Court; John C. Hitzman, of the Orphans' Court; and many other prominent citizens.

The services at the grave were according to the Masonic ritual, and the Rev. Father Hickey, who was a warm friend of the late general manager, made a touching allusion to his worth.
