

A WHITE HOUSE LIST.

The Utterances of Those Who Attack the Administration Are KEPT FOR FUTURE REFERENCE.

Scrap Books Are Now All the Style at the National Capital.

SOME OF THE NEW METHODS EMPLOYED

WASHINGTON, October 19.—The preservation of newspaper clippings has become an art in Washington. Public men, politicians, and members of Congress themselves are sent to the newspaper bureaus in New York; referring to subjects within their official scope; and newspaper correspondents seize every scrap which may bear on contemporaneous events or describe the personal peculiarities or odd adventures of men in public life.

An assistant in each of the papers and clips the marked articles, which he pastes together in a long ribbon. To this ribbon he adds every day, until it forms a heavy roll. Then at regular periods, he takes down the scrapbook, and pastes it into "lengths," pastes it in the gummed columns of the book. As soon as a book is filled, it is indexed and laid aside.


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
