Democrats Try to Force the Issue at Once on Their Opponents. PRACTICALLY A PARTY VOTE CAST. But the Absence of a Quorum Inadvisably Postpones the Matter.

First clash of partisans in the Senate. Republican proposal to recognize the Brazilian Republic matter to the Committee on Foreign Relations. The Democrats ask for immediate action. All but Mr. Call, of the Democrats vote for such action. Republicans solid against it. No quorum, and the matter goes over.

WASHINGTON, December 20.—In the Senate to-day Mr. Morgan presented a joint resolution recognizing the United States of Brazil as a free, independent and sovereign State, and proceeded to address the Senate in advocacy of it. Mr. Morgan declared that the attitude of the United States in respect of all the countries in the Western Hemisphere was a very distinct one. That attitude had been assumed very early in the history of the American Government—assumed sedately and confidently—and had been reasserted on every opportune occasion from the date of its announcement by President Monroe down to the last message from the President of the United States.
