Nothing is more certain than this. As Thales aptly says, "Art has this peculiarity, that it is at once a science, a manual, a matter of feeling, and a matter of intellect."

be true that we possess an art temperament—that the interest in this subject needs only direction in order to manifest itself in practical and efficient art education—what of the future?

It is, after all, a question of standard. If the standard in a city be low, the city is certainly the loser. To be a useful standard it must be visible. A permanent exhibition of works of art, including manufactured articles possessing artistic qualities, would work a revolution in the character of the products of Pittsburgh in years.

Now that it is certain we are to have, through the munificence of Mr. Carnegie, a magnificent home for the arts and sciences in Pittsburgh, we should see to it that, against the time this home is ready, there should at least be the nucleus about which may be formed a permanent collection of works which will forever exert a powerful influence upon the character of this city.

NO RUSSIAN REFORM.

George Kennan Adds to His Story of Horrors by Telling Why the Czar's Ministers Are Reluctant—Not a Hopeful Future.

CHICAGO, February 7.—Since the first long telegram was sent from this city to-day with George Kennan's offer in detail to prove all the horrors that had been alleged against administrative government in Yankoutak, that gentleman has been further interviewed on another important phase of his subject.

"All such announcements are merely ruses on the part of the Russian Government to distract the attention of the public from the spectacle, from time to time forced upon the vision of civilized nations, of unfortunate people being transported with such atrocious cruelties that humanity shudders at their recital."

"The constant endeavor of Russian diplomats is to lead outsiders to believe that a more liberal and humane policy in this respect is being pursued year after year, and to pull the wool over the eyes of such organizations as the Howard Society of Great Britain, to whom every credit should be given for the stand they have taken on this subject."

"The number of cases coming before the Minister of the Interior every year precludes any possibility of real investigation, he practically taking the report of subordinates as sufficient proof of the guilt of the prisoner. In many cases the examination of prisoners—their only form of trial—is conducted by the gendarmes who make the arrest. This then passes up and is decreed and endorsed by official after official until it reaches the Minister of the Interior, who signs it as a matter of course."
