

NO REBEL MEMORIAL. Other Than Simple Markers, to be Erected at Historic Gettysburg.

STATE G. A. R. MEN'S DECLARATION. A Breeze Raised by an Action Taken Some Time Ago by Patterson Post.

ELECTION OF NATIONAL DELEGATES. Major Denison and the Other New Officers Formally Installed.

Yesterday was the last day of the State G. A. R. encampment. Officers were chosen, and a resolution passed against permitting Confederate veterans to erect any monuments at Gettysburg.

FROM A STAFF CORRESPONDENT. SHAMOKIN, February 12.—The most exciting feature of the State Encampment of the G. A. R. to-day was the election of delegates to the National encampment at Boston this year.

There were 46 to elect out of 143 candidates. The voting took up most of the afternoon, and it was until 5 o'clock that the tellers were able to announce the result.

WESTERN PENNSYLVANIA DELEGATES. The last two named are alternates. Those elected from other sections of Western Pennsylvania were:

J. W. Cherry, of Allegheny; H. J. Gamble, of Monaca City; L. T. Bormann, of Warren; A. M. Carlin, of Braddock; C. M. Derrickson, of Mercer; J. R. O'Connell, of Erie; W. K. Critter, of Huntington.

Johnston, of Belmont; E. H. O'Neil, of New Castle; Butler, M. Pleasant, of Conneville; Scottsdale, of Leechburg; all had candidates, but they were defeated.

There was a delicate battle in the committee on Resolutions and in the convention on the action of the Patterson Post No. 88, of Allegheny, about that Confederate monument at Gettysburg.

NO CONFEDERATE MONUMENTS. The department is in favor of stone markers at Gettysburg, to indicate Confederate lines, but they will not countenance Confederate monuments there any more than the Alleghenians will.

Resolved, That this department favors all legislation relating to the battlefield of Gettysburg, which will tend to give to it intelligent idea of the position of the contending forces at the battle.

The other resolutions decided the Butler committee to bill in the Senate and that Appomattox had settled the race problem once and for all.

The installation ceremony was conducted by General Warner, of Philadelphia, and the colors of the department were presented to the new chief, Major Denison, of Pittsburgh.
