It is Showing Up Strong in the Butler Lot Well at McDonald.

DOING THIRTY BARRELS AN HOUR.

The Northern Well on the Whitesell Farm at Wildwood is Dry.

WEST VIRGINIA AND BUCKEYE NEWS

The talk of the day yesterday among oil men was the well of Clarke & Bannister on the Butler lot, at McDonald. It struck a pay in the fifth sand Tuesday afternoon and started off at 40 barrels an hour. Last evening it was reported to be making 20 barrels an hour. This well explains the theory that there is no oil in the fifth sand at McDonald, but it clinches the reputation of the field as a spotted one.

Near the Church. McCross—There is now only one string of rods in the Miller well at McDonald, Guffey & Co. They are drilling past the tools in the Andrews farm. It is only 70 feet from the sand. The Orton Oil Company's No. 1 well, on the Bell farm, is making 200 barrels a day. G. Gillespie & Co.'s No. 1 on the Hall, is down 120 feet; No. 2 same farm, is down 130 feet; No. 3, 140 feet; No. 4, 150 feet. The same firm's No. 7, Jane Riddle, is down 530 feet, and No. 8, on the same farm, will be spudded today. Their No. 6, on the James Riddle, which was started two days after the Bell farm well was struck, has been raised by Gillespie's firm, G. L. Simpson, and is now down 1,000 feet. It is being drilled faster than any well in the field. All of these wells are within a radius of 100 feet of the Bell farm well.

On the Frank Rock. PENNSYLVANIA—The well of Patterson, Callahan, Jennings & Co. on the Redpath farm is rigged up for pumping and is tested from the 100-foot.

Work at Coropols. COROPOLS—W. P. Black is building a rig for his No. 1 on the T. F. Watson farm in Coropols township. His No. 3 on the Ribber is due this week; his No. 4 is down 1,300 feet, and No. 6, 400 feet. Guffey Bros., well on the Cooper, just south of the borough, is due this week. It is an eastern edge well.

Washington County. CLAYVILLE—The Clayville Oil Company's No. 1, on the Daniel Irwin farm, is completed and will make 15 barrel pumper. Alken & Co. are down 220 feet on the Bate-Matthews farm. The Victor Oil Company are down 2,500 feet at their No. 3 on the John Carson farm.

THE MIDDLE OIL COMPANY CLAIMS TO HAVE BEEN BEATEN OUT OF \$50,000.

In the case of the Middle Oil Company brought yesterday against C. D. Greenlee and B. Forest to recover \$50,000, it is alleged that on February 3, 1911, the defendants represented to C. McKinley, the manager of the oil company, that they had a half interest in an oil and gas lease on 50 acres of the Bolshouse farm, in McDonald township. They said there were nine wells on the place when there were seven, and that the product was 500 barrels a day over the royalty.

On these representations the plaintiff company paid the defendants \$40,000, which, it is stated, was \$20,000 in excess of what the defendants would have got if it had been known that there were only seven wells and the net product not over 300 barrels a day to the working interest.
