BISHOP KAIN'S JUBILEE.

WILL BE UNITED IN DEATH.

A Runaway Accident Deprives a Betrothed Pair of Their Lives. NASHVILLE, July 2.—John Smith, a prominent farmer living near Franklin, met a tragic fate yesterday afternoon near that place. He was returning to town in a buggy accompanied by Miss Mary Dawson, and on passing a pond by the roadside where some boys were playing in the water, became frightened and ran away, turning the buggy over and throwing the occupants against the ground.

FEVER VICTIMS AT QUARANTINE.

The Surgeon's Staff on Chandeliers' Island to Be Reinforced. Bay St. Louis, La., July 2.—The latest news from the United States Quarantine Station on Chandeliers' Island is of Monday's date, the 29th. Dr. Groenvelt was alive yet, but no hope of his recovery was entertained. Dr. Carter is in charge, and has been taken ill, and at once telegraphed to Washington for a surgeon. It is expected that the general health will make a decided improvement.


