

MARSHAL PRIM.

The assassination of this great man, who was rightly looked upon as the real head of the Spanish nation, has excited general indignation throughout this country. It comes home to our people with peculiar force, for those who have suffered similar afflictions can always feel the more deeply the woes of their neighbors. Whether it was the work of a faction or of some desperate fanatic, the atrocity of the crime is the same, and its weight will fall heaviest upon those who investigated or made it possible. Yet, although it would appear at first blush, as did the assassination of Mr. Lincoln seem to be the work of the Confederate Government, to have been perpetrated in the interest, and with the connivance of a powerful organization, the Republican party of Spain, yet we believe, with the New York Tribune, that it will prove the independent act of an abandoned ruffian too vile to find accomplices and too ignorant to appreciate the folly and madness of his act. Its first logical result will doubtless be to establish on a firmer basis than seemed possible a week ago, the throne of the young Italian whose election has given occasion to this dastardly brutality. The Liberal cause will suffer most by the death of the great monarchist, and the newly transplanted son of Piedmont will enjoy a better chance of life now that it is watered with his blood.

America is much indebted to Marshal Prim. In 1862 he was in this country, and visited the Army of the Potomac, which he reviewed, and we believe witnessed a battle. He studied well the situation, and made himself thoroughly acquainted with our great resources; and when he returned to Europe, he gave so faithful an account of things to the French Emperor, that he was frightened out of his ideas, then almost matured, of recognizing the Confederacy. Therefore, we owe him a debt of gratitude, which we should never forget. He was our friend, and acted as such effectively in time of need.

The Tribune, which, in its enthusiasm for the Republic in Spain, and which we look upon as a chimeric, had, previous to his death, announced severely upon the Marshal; but now that he has been so foully dealt with, that paper does him noble justice, while it bitterly denounces the "deep damnation of his taking off." Now that he has gone hence, foully murdered, it says, we cannot withhold the expression of our conviction that Spain cannot afford to lose men of his calibre. He was cold, unsympathetic, calculating, and ambitious. But his highest aspiration was for the glory of Spain, and he bore unflinchingly long years of exile and persecution in his efforts to give her a government of liberty and progress. He was sometimes called a traitor to the Republic. The charge is false and unreasonable. He was never a Republican. When he came ashore in September, 1869, in that delicious hour when all Spain had gone wild with an easy triumph and an indefinite hope, a citizen snatched his cap and tried to run from it the crown that indicated his position in the army. He indignantly resented the liberty, and cried, "Down with the Dynasty, but live the Monarchy." From that hour to the election of Amadeus of Savoy he never ceased to advocate the coronation of a King for Spain.

He cared little for the glitter of apparent rank, but hungered and thirsted after actual power. When the Provisional Government came to be constituted he made Serrano Regent, and took for himself the Ministry of War and the Presidency of the Council. In this position he gave to Spain the best Government she has had for many years. He repressed the Republican revolts and the Carlist risings with prompt and impartial cruelty, and defended himself against all the factions in the Cortes with marvelous readiness and address. He always pretended he had no talent nor taste for public speaking, but there was not a lawyer nor a professor in the Chamber that could hold the attention of the house as he could. His speeches were models of address. He never lost his calm, though he often appeared to. But his bursts of feeling were as coolly calculated as his State papers, and as perfectly adapted to the desired effect. He was the first party leader in Spain, because his party trusted him—he never misled them and never deserted them.

No matter how critical the situation might seem, they always felt sure that Juan Prim would find a way out of it for himself, and then, too. He was a brave and skillful soldier, but was never so popular with the army as some greater inferior men. He was not a man of brilliant or imposing presence, and his reserved and quiet manner unpleasantly affected the rank and file. When Serrano rode by, his dashing and soldierly bearing excited a chorus of cries, but Prim was usually received with cold courtesy. The excitement of the battle-field, it is said, distinguished him, and the cool courage and insight that won the day at Castillejos made him also for a while the favorite of the soldiers. But he never shone on high holidays.

If as soldier, statesman, diplomatist, and ruler he was worthy of respect, as a man and a citizen he was altogether admirable. In that gay and dissolute capital, his house was sacred to the domestic virtues. His wife and children are mourning to-day a model husband and father. Cold as he seemed in speech and manner, he had friends who would have cheerfully died for him. He had that rare characteristic of truly noble minds—of never forgetting a

person he had once befriended. There is a general in the Spanish army who owes his rank to the fact that Prim saved his life in battle at the risk of his own when they were both subalterns. His worst faults were those of his country and his time. In some of those wonderful philippics of Castelar, the great tribune compared him with Washington and Cromwell, and predicted for him a disastrous and ignominious death. It is doubtful if a Washington or a Cromwell could have managed the Progressive party of Spain as well and as advantageously as Marshal Prim has done. He worked with the material he found. His deplorable end will rob him of no credit in impartial history, and if unatoned will only still further stain the black record of party strife in Spain.
