Too Much Corn to Hog. There is hardly a single farmer, with whose system of farming I am familiar, but feeds too much corn to his stock hogs.

Believing popular Education to be the one crying want of our State and of the country, we shall give large space to its advocacy.

When I say feed more grass, I do not mean to advise you to turn your sows and pigs, sows and stock hogs upon a short crop of any kind of grass, or upon an old field in which the noxious weeds and briars luxuriate.
