

VIRGINIA NEWS.

A band of gypsies are encamped near Lynchburg. Col. Dodson opened the Atlantic Hotel at Norfolk last Friday.

Commander Semmes is now with the cadets at the Alum Springs.

Work has been commenced on the new Market-house at Alexandria.

A heavy storm passed over the Augusta Valley on last Sunday evening.

A new Protestant Episcopal church is soon to be erected at Christiansburg.

There are now three hundred visitors at the Montgomery White Sulphur Springs.

The canal will be open between Lynchburg and Lexington by the 14th of September.

The circuit court for the county of Roanoke commences on the 14th day of September.

There was a heavy frost Thursday morning at the Greenbrier White Sulphur Springs.

Jabal Early and Jefferson Davis arrived at the White Sulphur Springs on last Thursday.

During the month of August there were ninety-five arrests in Lynchburg by the city police.

A grand jury ball is to be given at the Allegheny Springs, on Wednesday evening, the 6th inst.

Mr. Edward Mason had his left foot very badly mashed last week at Mason & Co's mill, in Scottsville.

The dry weather, in some portions of King George county, has been very damaging to the mill streams.

John J. Boyd sold his farm of 130 acres, near Martinsburg, for \$10,000 to Daniel Poole, of Frederick county, Md.

Col. M. G. Harman and A. A. Pitman, Esq., have purchased the National Hotel at Lexington, for the sum of \$17,300.

Mr. L. H. Johnson, of Bristol, has been appointed conductor on the sleeping car line between Lynchburg and Mobile.

The people of Martinsburg are much exercised about the supply of water. The springs, wells and cisterns, are nearly all dry.

A little daughter of Rev. J. H. Fox, living near Scottsville, fell from a porch one day last week, sustaining very painful injuries.

Mrs. Woodford B. Henley, died near Mt. Moriah, in Amherst county, on the 29th of August. She was formerly a Miss Magnan, of this city.

The tobacco barn of Mr. James H. Hicks, in Bedford county, was burned to the ground last week. It was full filled with tobacco.

Mr. Wm. J. Alden, of Petersburg, who has been very ill for the past week, was considered beyond the hope of recovery on Sunday night last.

On Friday last a deer, weighing 250 pounds, was brought to Petersburg by Mr. Butterworth, who killed it in Dinwiddie county the day before.

There was a land slide on the O., A. & M. railroad last Wednesday, between Charlottesville and Lynchburg, which delayed the train for several hours.

A fight with hatchets, took place in Prince William county, last week, between two men named Beavers and Pacey, in which the latter was dangerously wounded.

Captain Robert Banks is lying so very ill at his residence, near Petersburg, that two of his most intimate friends were refused the privilege of seeing him on last Sunday.

Mr. Benjamin Clement, an old citizen of Campbell county, died at his residence, near the court-house, on Tuesday last. He had reached the good old age of seventy-three years.

An United States soldier was stabbed and dangerously wounded a few days since, at Pamplin's depot, by a Southern gentleman. The names of the parties have not been ascertained.

In the letter of General Malcomb to Mr. Brooks, read in the Council last Friday, at Petersburg, the General announces his purpose to remove to Petersburg and make his home in that city.

A horse attached to a carriage dropped dead last Sunday in Petersburg. Several young men were in the carriage at the time enjoying an evening ride. The horse belonged to Elijah Eli.

Last Sunday Mrs. Sallie Moon, living near Scottsville, fell from the top of a flight of stairs to the bottom, her head heavily striking the floor. Mrs. Moon was severely injured in her sleep at the time.

A woman dressed in man's clothes, made her appearance in Portsmouth last Wednesday, but, woman-like, she came out with a parasol raised over her and failed to notice the discrepancy.

There was no preaching in any of the churches in Charlottesville last Sunday, except the Methodist and Lutheran, the pastors being absent taking a little recreation during the hot summer months.

A dead infant was found in the canal at Lynchburg last Thursday in an old coffee tin. The jury returned a verdict that the infant came to its death at the hands of some person or persons to them unknown.

One of the horses belonging to the city's steam engines, at Petersburg, had the honor of being ridden through the streets, last Saturday, by one of the drivers, so drunk that he could hardly maintain his seat in the saddle.

Mr. J. H. Crasman, an old gentleman residing in Fairfax county, while crawling between the cars of a freight train at Massass, last week, struck his head against an iron bolt on one of the cars, inflicting a severe laceration of the scalp.
