ROAD MAKING. - Harris in his "Walks and Talks" says: It took me three years to convince our pathmaker that it was just as well to lower the water two feet below the road as to raise the road two feet above the water. A good deal cheaper. He finally let me work out my tax by digging a ditch on the side of the road. I am not sure that he sees the point, but the road is now dry, firm, and good. I lowered the water two feet below the road for half the money it would have cost to raise the road six inches.

SUGAR FROM THE BEET. - The product of the sugar beet experiment at the Massachusetts Agricultural College, has been four thousand barrels of heads from five acres. A very large amount, and on a small scale for the manufacture of the sugar, of which some of the finest granulated has been produced. It is said the best (the French sugar beet) yielded thirteen per cent. in sugar, while all the nutritive parts are left for food to stock. All that comes from the ground is left to be put again in the ground, thus continually increasing the soil. It is said to be profitable when the heads yield seven per cent. of sugar.

WHITE MUSTARD FOR SOILING. - Mr. Harris has grown a crop of white mustard the past season on a low and rather wet piece of land. The field was plowed three times, and the mustard sown in July. At the same time clover and timothy were sown - the clover catching well. The mustard yielded an immense quantity of food per acre, which was fed to all kind of stock. Sugar beets and pigs were especially fond of it. Cows ate it freely, and it did not affect the taste of milk. Mr. H. says the crop may be sown early in the spring, after danger of frost has past, cut and fed, and another crop grown in the fall feeding. We saw the crop in the fall, and thought well of it. It is worthy of attention. In England it is quite popular.
