THE BALLOT FOR TEMPERANCE.

Friends of Temperance of Augusta County:
You are identified with a cause which is being felt and extending its influence throughout the length and breadth of our land. Are you in earnest in this good work? Do you sincerely desire to remove that evil which is the curse of our land, affecting every family, invading every domestic hearth, pervading every social circle, looming up in every community; everywhere stalking abroad, peeping into the sanctuaries of the home, and recruiting the army of eternity with lost souls. Are you afraid of pursuing its cruel work of breaking hearts of parents and blighting the hopes of children. Are you prepared to wage an incessant warfare, to give battle to your armor, your weapons being Moral and Legal Suasion—and be ready at all times to "quit yourselves like men."

Much good has been done by moral suasion, but it has not been enough, and saved even from the midst of the deepest ruin, and multitudes have become drunkards. But, brothers, moral suasion has its limits. It will neither prevent the child from drinking nor the man from drinking. It is too feeble to combat the drunkard's appetite when excited by temptation, and the selfishness by which unprincipled men are actuated. With temperance, we must be armed with the sword of the law, and the facilities of reforming inebriated men, every day, facilities pressing them on all sides, and drink companions ready to lure them into the numerous bar-rooms, it is not to be wondered at if so many have fallen and gone back to their cups.

If these weak brethren are to be delivered, the temptation must be removed, and this by the interposition of law. So long as men are weak as crums, to resist temptation, and to preach total abstinence unless we have the same time practically enforced, by law, the precept of the Lord's prayer, "Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us therefrom," is more than a prayer. It is a vain wish, and a vain hope. Does any one think for a moment that intemperance and its concomitant evils can be banished from the land by moral suasion only, who are permitted to sell and traffic in the unholy traffic of liquor-selling—the fruitful and only source of all drunkenness. Never! To talk of persuading such men as are everywhere to be found engaged in liquor-selling, to abstain from the sale of their wares, is as long as money can be made by the traffic, there are men who would build their grogeries in the crater of a volcano. They would sell rum, did the law permit them, amid the hearing of an earthquake; and where the drunkard steps down the bank and hangs suspended by a single twig over the bottomless pit, they would put between his chattering teeth the draught of lead and plunge him into an eternal abyss. And shall we talk of moral suasion to such men? Only the pains and penalties of law will make them feel what righteousness and truth cannot make them see.
