How to MAKE GOOD BUTTER.—There is nothing better than good butter, and nothing worse than bad butter.

The proper method of making good butter? The process followed by a lady sending to the Cincinnati market, and who makes "gilt edge butter," is as follows: "In summer she sets milk in deep cans in cold water; in winter she sets it in the same cans in the kitchen; when it is cooled it is covered close; she keeps the temperature at 58 in summer and 64 in winter. If the cream is too cold it should be warmed by setting in water and stirred until of the proper temperature. It is then churned slowly with a steady motion until the butter comes, raised down, taken out of the churn, washed in milk, then in cold water, salt 1 oz. to the pail, then work again to get all the milk out and made into rolls. In regard to the salt used care should be taken to use only pure salt, dairy salt, if possible. Extreme cleanliness should be observed in order to avoid that "cowy" odor, which is so disagreeable. Cleanliness of the cow's udder is of the first consideration. When the butter globules are the size of wheat grains it will be well to draw off the butter-milk and then gather. Too much working makes butter greasy—especially if the butter is to be kept for any length of time. To break the coating of butter globules, a blow should begin not a whirling movement, that makes butter come by friction, not by a concussion, and the globules are mashed, not broken. The same is done in working butter. The butter must be pressed, not smeared. Let the milk stand not longer than 24 hours in summer and 36 in winter. Each time cream is added to that in the cream jar or bucket, it is thoroughly stirred, and if possible let stand 12 hours before churning, after the last is added, so that it will all be of an equal ripeness. The very best time to churn cream is when it is barely thick—not what we call solid clabber, but like thin jelly.
