A military mass, in which armed sailors took part, was celebrated Sunday on board the French frigate in the harbor of Baltimore.

Rev. L. R. Mason, rector of Trinity Episcopal Church, Shepherdstown, W. Va., has accepted a call to an Episcopal Church at Pensacola, Fla.

The Swiss government has prohibited the holding of meetings by the Salvation Army and has closed the halls occupied by the Salvationists.

The Savannah News tells of a woman in Watley, Ga., who has become a grandmother at the age of 30. She married when only 14, and her daughter did likewise.

The last maize crop in the United States was grown on a larger area than has ever before been planted; the total produce was the greatest yet obtained—namely, 1,988,000,000 bushels.

Engineer Seth Twombly and Conductor Charles Buford were indicted in Chicago Saturday, charged with the murder of the seven victims of the Rock Island Railroad disaster at Englewood, Ill.

The visit of the Prince of Wales to Egypt is considered in France as an effort on the part of England to increase her prestige on the Nile and to re-affirm her right of a protectorate over Egypt.

The largest university in the world is at Vienna, with 5,200 students and 385 professors; while the largest college is at Cairo, Egypt, having 300 professors and 10,000 students of Mohamud.

Eighty-two converts from Sam Jones' meeting presented themselves at the First Baptist Church, Lynchburg, Monday night of last week, for membership, and were baptized Tuesday afternoon.

The czar has refused to recognize Prince Ferdinand as a ruler of Bulgaria, and will not accept any form of settlement of the Bulgarian question which excludes Russia's claim to the right to elect the head of the new government.

The Westinghouse Electric Light Company of Pittsburgh, Pa., has just secured the contract to erect a central station for a very large electric light plant in Peking, China. The town is to be lit up throughout with incandescent lamps.

The large barn and outbuildings owned by Andrew Yarn, situated near Carlisle, Penn., were totally destroyed by fire Friday last, together with the crops and farming implements. The loss is \$6,000, partly insured.

Sheriff Reynolds, W. A. Holmes and Eugene M. Dutton, while taking eight Apache Indians and one Mexican to Yuma penitentiary, Saturday morning, were killed by their prisoners four miles from Riverside, Arizona.

Judge Leeper once owned one hundred and sixty acres of land near Pierre, the new capital of Dakota. The land would now be worth \$250,000, but the judge sold it for \$3,000, and is now shoveling coal for a living.

A man named Whitmore was struck by a Shenandoah Valley train last week, and instantly killed. This accident occurred near Natural Bridge station. He attempted to cross the track in front of the approaching train.

From the Egyptian manuscripts owned by the Austrian Archduke Rainer it appears that printing with movable types was practiced in Egypt in the ninth century of our era, and that a paper factory existed in Bagdad as early as 704.

Lord Salisbury, the English premier, has sent an emphatic protest to Berlin against the declaration of a German protectorate over a portion of the east coast of Africa, maintaining that the British East Africa Company has acquired rights over the territory.

Remarkable beds of coal have just been opened up on the new branch of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railroad on Paint creek, Kanawha county, W. Va. The coal seams just exposed show six and thirteen feet in thickness of the finest splint gas and coking coals.

TO PREPARE A MUSTARD PASTER.—Mix the mustard with the white of an egg, beat it well, and add a little salt. The result will be a paste which will "draw" a pimple, but will not produce a blister, even upon the skin of an infant, no matter how thick it is allowed to remain upon the part.

Berlin advises as to the effect that the visit of Count Kaloky, the Austro-Hungarian prime minister, who arrived in Berlin Saturday, to Prince Bismarck and Emperor William's visit to Turkey are intended to strengthen the peace of Europe; the Emperor reached Constantinople Saturday.

Within the last six months, according to the estimate of the Custom house authorities of San Francisco, over \$400,000 worth of opium has been smuggled into this country, most of it by way of the Pacific coast. Only 150 boxes have been legally shipped since July 30th, while the yearly consumption usually averages over 1,000 boxes.
