Brakeman Killed at Afton. The Charlottesville Progress says that, on Saturday morning last, J. A. Harris, a brakeman on the No. 94, fell between two cars at Afton, the wheels passing over his body, and he died instantly. His train was making the side track, in order that another night train, and in some unaccountable manner, it fell and slipped and he fell as above stated, the accident resulting in instant death. The unfortunate young man was from Basic City.

DEATHS. With the relatives and friends, this entire community deeply mourns the death of Mrs. Matilda K. Trout, which occurred at her late residence on West Augusta street in the early morning of the 2nd instant, aged nearly 76 years. The deceased was the widow of Mr. Nicholas K. Trout, an honored and popular citizen, who died in 1875. As deputy clerk in the courts, a member of the bar, of the State is familiarly known in connection with the Legislature, and Mayor of the city, his memory is justly cherished in association with the public service he rendered for a life of the kindest character with his fellow-men. Mrs. Trout was the daughter of Mr. Erasmus Strickland, one of the old clerks of Augusta county, whose character and public services were so touchingly portrayed by the late Judge Shaffer, for the volume lately published by Mr. Frederick Johnston, of Salem, Va., sketching the characters and services of the "old clerks of Virginia." She was a sister of the late Dr. Francis T. Strickling, an eminent physician, whose name and service are historic as the Superintendent of the Western Lunatic Asylum.

Mrs. Trout was a devoted Christian, and faithful to the duty enjoined upon membership of Trinity Episcopal church, and as the same teacher enlarged the scope of effective work; to minister to the needy and care for the afflicted, where her hands and comforting words found opportunity. The sickness which caused her death was of short duration. In sweet repose and in the full assurance of heaven, she passed away to her rest with the saints.

Her husband and three children preceded her to the grave—Mrs. H. M. McIlhenny, Miss Fanny and Mr. E. Strickling Trout. Those who were present at the funeral services were: Mr. G. L. Cooke, Misses Sallie M. G. Loebe, Hattie and Mr. Nicholas K. Trout, of Colorado.

The funeral services took place in the Trinity Episcopal church, Rev. W. Q. Hullihen, Rector, on the afternoon of the 3rd instant, and the burial in Trinity cemetery, where those of the family who have gone before are buried.

The young ladies of the Virginia Female Institute, Mrs. General J. E. B. Stuart, Principal, of which Miss Hattie Trout, a daughter of the deceased, is one of the faculty, attended the services in a body.

The rich floral tributes beautified the sacred testimonials to one so much beloved.

The pall-bearers were Messrs. H. M. McIlhenny, C. L. Cooke, F. T. Strickling, J. H. Skinner, P. H. Cooke and A. F. Kinney.

Mr. William S. Beard, a highly respected citizen, whose home was near Fort Defiance in this county, died in St. Luke's Home in Richmond at 3 o'clock on Friday last, Nov. 4th, after a surgical operation, aged 38 years, leaving a widow and several children.

The funeral services were performed at the residence of Mr. Day T. Beard and his wife, who survives him, was Miss Nina Stout, the only daughter of Mr. Thornton G. Stout.

His remains arrived here on the train Saturday evening, where they were taken to his home, and at 11 o'clock on Sunday morning the funeral services were performed at Mr. Hersh Church by Rev. J. W. Wolfe.

The pall-bearers were his brothers and brothers-in-law.

A large number of persons attended to pay the last tribute of love and respect to the deceased.
