

King Oscar's Graceful Act.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 17.—King Oscar II of Sweden and Norway has given further evidence of his kindly feeling to America by greeting a granite monument on the spot where Mr. and Mrs. Daniel W. Youmans of New York city met their death of July 4 last.

The circumstances of King Oscar's graceful act are reported to the State Department, with photographs of the monument erected by him. Mr. Youmans and his wife, while driving along a road near Bergen, were backed off a declivity and killed. Consul Many writes that when the King passed the point soon afterward he placed a beautiful bouquet on the wooden cross marking the spot and directed the chief official of the district to replace the wooden cross with a granite monument. This has been completed and is an imposing shaft of rough-hewn stone.

On one face the circumstances of the accident are briefly given and "Oscar II erected this memorial." The Secretary of State has made suitable acknowledgment and has directed that our minister convey to the minister for foreign affairs a suitable expression in behalf of the Secretary of State.

The Weatherholtz Case. WOODSTOCK, Nov. 17.—In the county court here a nolle prosequi was entered in the indictment against Elmer A. Weatherholtz, who was tried at the August term of this court for the murder of his wife in this county last February. It will be remembered that at the trial the jury rendered a verdict of murder in the second degree and fixed the punishment at eighteen years in the penitentiary, but which verdict was set aside by the court as being contrary to the evidence adduced in the trial of the case.

As the higher this State prohibits retrial for a higher offense than the accused has been convicted of, this was the only course for the court to pursue. Weatherholtz will be held on an indictment for attempting to kill his mother-in-law some time previous to the killing of his wife. He was returned to Winchester for safe keeping until the December term, when the trial case will be heard.
