TODAY'S SPECTATOR.

Our readers will observe, is printed on paper of unusually fine quality. This paper came as a present to us from the new paper mills recently built at Covington, Va., by the West Virginia Pulp and Paper Co. This paper is made from wood fiber and is of beautiful finish and elegant texture.

It is not the first paper mill in Virginia to manufacture wood into paper. Mills of this character are found at Richmond and Buena Vista, but the Covington mill is the largest of its kind, and is the most modern mill in all of its appliances in the south, if not in this country.

The paper shows our readers is book paper, far too costly and elegant for any ordinary newspaper to use, but we desire to call attention to what is going on in Virginia and especially within the Tenth Congressional District by especially mentioning it.

It always gives pleasure to the Virginia readers of the SPECTATOR, we know, to learn that persons here before strangers have selected a habitation among them, that they realize and show their appreciation of our advantages for manufacturing purposes, by becoming a part and parcel of us, and those readers feel interested in knowing just what such manufactures are doing and how it is done.

Just what they are doing can in some measure be gathered from an examination of this paper, but how they do this, and the scale upon which they manufacture can only be realized by a visit to their mills.

Some years ago the impression existed that while paper could be made from wood, it was of a cheap character, and used only in newspaper work or other work where a low grade sufficed, and that rags, and especially linen rags, were absolutely necessary to give strength and finish.

This idea has long been exploded, and the forests are being felled and paper made from wood, on which the best book work is done and where the finest steel plate engravings show the beauty which would be marred if printed on other than paper of superb quality and fineness.

The Covington mills bring their supply of pulp wood almost entirely from that portion of West Virginia known as the Shaver's fork of Cheat river, and have established an industry which cannot fail to lend greatly to the prosperity and prestige of both Virginia and West Virginia, and become a source of profit to those who have inaugurated the enterprise.

The SPECTATOR takes this method of acknowledging its grateful recognition of the gift, and of introducing this new enterprise to our thousands of readers, and also generally to the people among whom it has cast its lot, assuring our new friends in the enterprise that they have come among a generous and appreciative people, and that they have the heartiest good wishes for their personal welfare and prosperity.

We especially desire to state that our country of Augusta is large and attractive, our city of Staunton is interesting and beautiful. The latter has merchants and business men and banking facilities second to few, our schools are not excelled, and our people courteous and refined. No harm could therefore result in an acquaintance, or in mutual friendship with us, which, now as we are neighbors, we hope will follow.

The Rockbridge News has given Augusta some advice which no doubt will be gratefully received and may do good. There are few sections where wisdom is more honored, or sooner recognized with gratitude than here. But Augusta knows the sort of defeat, she knows the pangs of neglect, indifference to her sons, yet should it be her fate this time he called upon to vote for a Congressional candidate other than one of her citizens, she will do so with zeal and party loyalty, and remember the good advice and sympathy vouchsafed by the News.

SHINPLASTERS VS. SILVER.

We cannot tell in advance whether the Democratic convention which is this week in session at Kansas City, will adopt the 16 to 1 plank of the Chicago platform or not, and it is unstar-trial. At the time that plank was adopted money was scarce, the Democratic party saw that the volume of currency must be increased, and in its opinion the best way to do it was to coin silver, because an issue of paper money was then impossible and besides not in its opinion wise. That party believed a silver dollar was better than a paper dollar and believes so now, it believed that a silver dollar was far better than a National bank dollar and believes so now, and it knew it was far less expensive. But the banks were in the ascendency. They knew and saw if silver was coined on the same basis as gold their shin plasters would not flood the country, and their power would be curtailed, so they went to work and helped beat an issue that would have beaten them. The Democratic party was not a silver party per se, that is not for silver for silver's sake, and few of its members were silver owners, so that the campaign lie which stated that the Democratic party was run by the Silver Trust was as base as the mind that conceived it. There was not and never has been a silver trust. Had there been it would have joined its brethren of the Republican party. The Democratic party has not seen silver coined at 16 to 1, it may never see it, and it is not material that it should, if the volume of currency is maintained with good substantial money, but that party has just seen the principle for which it contended, which was an increase in the circulating medium, fully exemplified by Republican legislation during the last session of Congress. Congress, as a reward for contributions to the last campaign fund has just turned over to the national bank trust the right and power of issuing ALL THE PAPER MONEY the country is to have, except some gold and silver certificates which will be issued by the government, possibly as the banks dictate. These bank notes are nothing but fiat money, they rest upon the faith of the government, and possess all of the elements of the greenback which was so roundly denounced a few years ago. They are no worse, but no better. The banks by government bonds and having these bonds they are allowed to issue dollar for dollar on them. The Democratic party believes a silver dollar at the ratio of sixteen to one, is better money than the bank shinplasters, and so many anybody not interested in the banks who possess an ordinary reason. Instead of a national bank shinplaster the Democratic party prefers that the government issue this paper money direct, and thus avoid the enormous interest on the bonded debt. Its promise to pay made in a bank note is as good as its promise in a bond, hence there could be no danger of the worth of these notes, as long as we have a government, and thus could the people have been relieved from a national bank dynasty.

But let these questions be as they may, it comes with poor grace from the present denouncers of silver, to curse the Democratic party because it wanted silver dollars instead of national bank shinplasters. The Republican party has supplied the lack of currency with these, the Democrats would have helped the cause with silver. Whiching then Benzoniari, will you serve the national bank shinplaster or the United States silver dollar? Which is the better dollar, the one the Democrats tried to give, or the Republicans have given? Which do the people prefer a silver dollar or a paper shinplaster?

Prohibition Ticket. The National convention of the Prohibition party was held in Chicago last week, and the following ticket was nominated: For President, John G. Woolley, of Illinois; for Vice-President, Henry B. Metcalf, of Connecticut.

He has resided in Chicago since 1892.

Henry B. Metcalf, of Rhode Island, practiced law in New York City, and was born seventy-one years ago. He is president of the Providence County Savings Bank and superintendent of the Sunday-school of the Church of Our Father in Providence, R. I. Mr. Metcalf was formerly a Republican, but joined the Prohibition party several years ago and has been prominently identified with that party since. He has been the candidate of his party for governor several times.
