ARRIVAL OF THE AMERICA.

THREE DAYS LATER FROM EUROPE.

HALIFAX, July 20, 11 P. M.—The steamer America, with Liverpool dates of the 10th instant and 60 passengers, has arrived.

The anniversary of the 4th of July was celebrated on board the steamer Baltic in patriotic style.

Apart from the elections, the news is unimportant. The markets are dull, owing to the political excitement.

MARKETS. The Cotton market was unchanged. The sales of the week were 36,250 bales, of which speculators took 5,550 bales, and exporters 6,000 bales.

The weather throughout Europe was fine, and crops in all parts of Europe were remarkably prosperous.

ENGLAND.—The elections for members of Parliament had been held in most of the boroughs, and the result was adverse to the Ministry. The county elections may, however, make a change.

The Daily News classifies the members elect as 156 Liberals and 80 Conservatives. The Times makes the result so far 139 Liberals, 58 through Ministerialists, and 28 Liberal Conservatives.

The Royal Agricultural Society of Liverpool offer a prize of 1000 pounds and a gold medal for the discovery of a manure equal to guano, to be delivered in England at 5 pounds per ton.

A. Duncan & Son, of Dundee, in the flax trade, have failed. Their liabilities are twenty thousand pounds, and their assets small.

The brothers Stratford, recently imprisoned in Italy, have arrived at Liverpool.

FRANCE.—Rumors are afloat of ministerial changes. M. Droubin, D. L'Huy's is said to have been offered the Foreign Department.

M. Baroch, the Interior, and M. Foulds, the Department of Finance, are also mentioned.

Some alarm was felt, lest it was the intention of the government to impose a salt duty.

The insurrection in Algeria had been suppressed for the present.

The Monitor contradicts the statement that disaffection had been discovered in one of the regiments of the Line.

It was reported both at London and at Paris, that Louis Napoleon had informed the British Government that he is prepared to admit certain English staples into France on easy terms, provided the British import duties on Wines be repealed.

The condition of vineyards were less unsatisfactory in the Board de Lais than in the Rhone.

The prices of Wheat and Flour had declined on account of the promised abundance.

PORTUGAL.—The St. Ubes Salt Monopoly may be considered suppressed as the American, English, Russian and other vessels are loading on the same terms as the Portuguese.

SWITZERLAND.—The Sonderbund party in Tyroling have appealed to the Federal Council against the measures taken to break up their organization.

SARDINIA.—The Government has established a quarantine on all vessels coming from New Orleans and Mobile, on account of the Cholera in Louisiana.

HUNGARY.—Dembrinski and Szemere wrote to the Journal des Debats at Paris, denying that they offered the Crown of Hungary to Russia—George being the only man who possessed it.

CAPE OF GOOD HOPE.—Dates to the 29th of May bring no news. The Kafir war is no nearer a termination. Gen. Cathcart had announced to the enemy that no terms would be listened to but submission or defeat.

Case of Drowning—Perilous Position of a Man at Niagara Falls.

BUFFALO, July 19.—Merritt Graves, aged 21, a son of S. V. R. Graves, Esq., late Sheriff of Erie county, was drowned yesterday evening, while bathing in the harbor.

Late last night, a man was discovered in a boat in the rapids, near the brink of the Falls of Niagara. The boat stuck fast on a rock.

The man in the boat was a fisherman, named Johnson. He was on a rock between Goat Island and the Canada shore, and directly above the Falls.

Notwithstanding the imminent peril, a man named Joel Robinson, at the peril of his life, went to his relief in a small skiff, taking a rope from the island, and succeeded in rescuing him from the boat.

About five minutes after Johnson was taken from the boat, it loosened from the rock and went over the Falls. He had been in that situation since 12 o'clock last night, and was intoxicated. A purse of \$200 was made up by the visitors for Robinson.

General Avas and the Mexican Outrages.

NEW ORLEANS, July 19, 1852.—The Brownsville Flag, of the 10th inst., publishes a correspondence between the American Consul at Matamoros and General Avas, respecting the outrage on the steamer Camanche, and other Avas justifies the Camanche affair; says his officers stole cattle from the Mexicans; denies all knowledge of the other outrages, and closes with a threat that while the leaders in the recent revolution receive protection from the Americans, the frontiers need not expect security.

Obsequies of Henry Clay.

NEW YORK, July 20.—The arrangements made to-day for the funeral honors to Mr. Clay, were the most extensive and imposing ever witnessed on this continent. The exhibition of regret was confined to no class or party, but was joined in by all. All yesterday afternoon and this morning the proprietors of stores and public buildings along the route of procession were engaged in dressing their buildings in mourning. At noon to-day Broadway presented a spectacle at once the grandest and most solemn that can be conceived.

Nothing occurred during the progress of the procession to mar the solemnity of the occasion, and the effect produced by this mournful but magnificent pageant was one that could not fail to deeply impress all who beheld it.

Death of a Wealthy Merchant.

St. Louis, July 19.—George Collins, an eminent merchant of this city, and extensively known, died yesterday. He leaves property estimated at over a million.

The Otsego Bank Robbery.

ALBANY, July 19.—Larned, the Otsego Bank robber, has been sentenced to the State prison for five years. An appeal, however, has been taken.

Death of Bishop Henshaw.

PROVIDENCE, R. I., July 20.—A dispatch received here from Frederick, Md., states that Bishop Henshaw, of the Protestant Episcopal Church of this diocese, died near that city to-day.

New Line of Steamers.

QUEBEC, July 20.—Arrangements are making for a new line of steamers to run between Liverpool and this city in Summer, and between Liverpool and Portland in Winter.

Congress.

WASHINGTON, July 21. In the SENATE, a resolution calling for information relative to the boundary commission was adopted. The resolution fixing the day for the adjournment of Congress was taken up and debated.

The HOUSE took up the bill granting the right of way to railroads and plank roads across the public lands, but before the subject was disposed of, went into committee of the whole on the river and harbor bill.

The Fish Difficulty.

Boston, July 21. Mr. Webster has communicated a dispatch to the Courier, of this city, from Mr. Everett, while minister to England, to Mr. Buchanan, then Secretary of State, dated April, 1845, in which it is stated that the British Government relinquished the exclusive right to fish in the Bay of Fundy.

NEW YORK, July 21. Advice from Hayti to the 3d instant state that Souloque was making active preparations to attack the Dominicans in August next.

Sailing of the Canada.

Boston, July 21. The Canada sailed for Liverpool to-day, taking out 58 passengers and \$332,000 in specie.
