SPRIT OF THE PRESS.
Yesterday's *Whig*, while it intimates its opposition to the Pacific Railroad, because it will tend to more corruption and greater increase of the patronage of the government, than any project that can be well imagined, declares that it is a mere passenger prepared for any contingency that may arise. If it could see any "vigorous and concerted effort to save the Government from the gulf of consolidation," it would joyfully sustain it; but "under existing circumstances," it is "of necessity content to let matters take their course."

The *Enquirer* continues its argumentation upon the Pacific Railroad—directing its attention to the chief ground upon which the *Secretary of War*, and the *Washington Union* base their support of the project, viz: "the common defence." The *Enquirer* thinks this the very weakest argument that could be offered for it—it "had supposed that if there was an impossible ground on which the measure could be rested, it would be this very ground of common defence." The *Enquirer* declares that when it looks at the Union's argument "for the common objects of this common defence (that is to say common in regard to the whole Union) we [they] see but the single specification of San Francisco city, or at most California." The *Enquirer* proceeds to argue upon this point at length, utterly denying any force whatever in the scheme as one of necessity as a military road for the common defence.

The *Times*, alluding to the cause of quarrel between Turkey and Russia, considers it essentially the same as that which gave rise to the crusades more than seven hundred years ago.

The *Examiner* commences its editorial dissertations yesterday, by a speculative article upon the designs of Russia, taking as its text, some suggestions of the *London Sun*. The *Examiner* thinks it not improbable that Russia covets the dominion of China, and that she will shape her diplomacy and military manoeuvres, so as to accomplish that object. It believes in the success of this grand scheme, and that in course of time the Muscovite will prevail in the East, and the Republic of the U. States, in the West—the two great political powers dividing the world between them.

The *Examiner* also has an elaborate and very interesting article on "Ghost Mania," referring to many remarkable delusions in past days and their solutions. It contends that after the exposure of all unnatural and mysterious performances—that after the proof, "that whatever coincides with the revelations of the Bible and the experience of mankind for three thousand years, is the result of imposture, jugglery, or sleight of hand and knavish trickery"—"it is disgraceful that the people of the United States should be made the laughing stock of the civilized world, by the numberless humbugs that afflict the land!" This is too true.

TO EUROPE IN LESS THAN FOUR DAYS!
An English paper announces a new and improved construction in vessels, which has undergone actual experiment whereby the voyage from England to the United States will be accomplished "in considerably less than four days!" With that (if it ever is) and the submarine telegraph from Halifax to Galway, we shall be very near neighbors to the English.

COAL AND GOVERNMENT AGENCIES.
The government has found out—and so have the cunning ones who are ever watching out for jobs—that the commissions on the purchases of coal for government vessels are enormous. One firm—Howard & Aspinwall—is understood to have made \$25,000 on the supplies of the Japan squadron. Of course there were numerous applicants for jobs of this sort; but the Washington Star says the government has determined to abolish them altogether, and has instructed that the regular officers of the service make their own coal purchases, except where it may be necessary on special occasions to employ a special agent.

egleston Dumas was on Saturday re-examined before the Mayor of Petersburg on the charge of stabbing his wife on the 22d ult. He was sent on for trial before the Hustings Court. Mrs. Dumas had sufficiently recovered from the effects of the stabbing to be able to appear and testify against her affectionate spouse.

"Blind Johnny" had his day in Richmond Market, Baltimore, Sunday. He preached his sermon to an immense crowd, and "spoke his mind" about "rum" and "drinking" without molestation.

It is understood that the Governor of Pennsylvania has granted a respite to Capie and Emmo, under sentence of death in Philadelphia for the murder of Soohan.

The second trial of James W. Schaumburg, in Washington, is set for the December term of the criminal court.

Breck's monument, near Niagara, which was split and disfigured by the Canadian rebels in 1838, has recently been entirely demolished by order of the British Government, for the purpose of reconstructing it.

"HISTORY OF THE CAPTIVITY OF NAPOLEON AT ST. HELENA, from the Journal of Sir Hudson Lowe, and official Documents not before made public."—A book with this title has just been published in London. It has not appeared on this side of the Atlantic, but from an analysis of it in the last number of the *London Athenaeum*, it appears that it is intended as a defence of Sir Hudson. He seems to have been a mere tool of the British Ministry in his brutal and unfeeling treatment of the illustrious exile, and that all was done "by authority." These volumes, says the *Athenaeum* "leave no shadow of doubt that for a while Dr. O'Meara acted as government spy upon Napoleon, and amused the Prince Regent, with his revelations of the torture which the Emperor suffered." It would seem, however, that he relented, either from shame, compassion to the Emperor, or because the Ministry refused to pay him as agreed. We await the publication of the book in this country, and leave the dissection of it to the "Bachelor," (or as Syme of the Petersburg Intelligencer styles him the "Field Marshal") and doubt not that on his return from the Springs he will accomplish it to the satisfaction of all, having devoted much time to the study of everything which relates to Napoleon.
