The New School Presbyterian General Assembly of the United States, at its late session at Cleveland, Ohio, took each action in reference to the Southern (New School) Presbyterian Church, as would hereafter make the "sin of slaveholding" the basis of discipline by the authorities of the Church.

Man Hanged by a Vigilance Committee in Rockingham county, Va. Jefferson Randall, who had been sent from Rockingham county, Va., by a Vigilance Committee, for numerous lawless acts, such as burning barns, robberies, and planning the assassination of certain prominent citizens in that county, returned there on Friday last. SCARCITY OF CORN.—The Raleigh and Gaston Railroad Company, in consideration of the great scarcity of corn in North Carolina, are charging only half price on all the corn carried into that State on their road. A public meeting of the citizens of Halifax county, N. C., was held at Weldon a few days ago, at which the sum of \$1000 was contributed to buy corn for the poor. Some idea of the extent of the dearth may be formed from the fact (as we are informed) that the number of vessels which passed through the Weldon Swamp Canal in the month of May of the present year was 133 less than in the same month last year; while most of those carrying corn were but partially laden.

A HUSBAND SUPPOSED TO HAVE BEEN POISONED BY HIS WIFE.—About a month ago, Mr. R. was of Mandana, Oondaga county, New York, was taken ill, and died suddenly. Last week some suspicious circumstances having come to light, the body was taken up, and an inquest held upon it. It was found that the deceased had been poisoned with arsenic, and that the wife was the person who administered the poison. She was arrested, and is now in custody of the law.
