LOCAL MATTERS. THE PRIMARY ELECTION. THE PLAN ADOPTED BY THE CITY CONSERVATIVE COMMITTEE. The following is the plan for holding a primary election adopted by the City Conservative Committee Tuesday night:

1. A primary election shall be held by the Conservative party of the city of Richmond for candidates for municipal and State offices twenty days prior to the general election in May, 1876, which shall determine the choice of the candidates for candidates to be voted for at that election.

2. Three well-known Conservative citizens of integrity and intelligence from each ward shall be selected by the City Central Conservative Committee, who will render their services voluntarily as commissioners on the day of election at the voting-places in each ward of the city.

3. Primary elections shall be held at one voting-place in each ward of the city. 4. Ward commissioners shall conduct the election in their several wards.

5. Ward commissioners, officials, and clerks conducting primary elections shall not be candidates in nomination for any office to be voted for in said primary elections in which they may be engaged.
