THE NORTH CAROLINA CAMPAIGN—GOVERNOR VANCE'S RETURN HOME.

CHARLOTTE, N. C., AUGUST 30.—Governor Vance returned home to-night after an absence of several weeks, during which time he has been engaged stumping a considerable portion of the State in his own interests as candidate for Governor. He has made about forty speeches during this time, and gained a complete victory over his competitor, Settles, on each occasion. He was met at the train by the Tilden and Vance Club with the silver cornet band and appropriate transparencies, and escorted to Independence Square, thence to his residence. At the square the crowd halted, and amid cheer after cheer called for a speech from their beloved standard-bearer. Notwithstanding the Governor was very much exhausted, after such an extensive stumping tour, he complied with their request, and gave them, though short, one of his characteristic, good, and patriotic speeches; after which the band discoursed sweet music. The crowd cheered again and dispersed. Knowing ones claim that Vance will certainly carry the State by at least 15,000 majority.

C., AUGUST 30.—Governor Vance returned home to-night after an absence of several weeks, during which time he has been engaged stumping a considerable portion of the State in his own interests as candidate for Governor. He has made about forty speeches during this time, and gained a complete victory over his competitor, Settles, on each occasion. He was met at the train by the Tilden and Vance Club with the silver cornet band and appropriate transparencies, and escorted to Independence Square, thence to his residence. At the square the crowd halted, and amid cheer after cheer called for a speech from their beloved standard-bearer. Notwithstanding the Governor was very much exhausted, after such an extensive stumping tour, he complied with their request, and gave them, though short, one of his characteristic, good, and patriotic speeches; after which the band discoursed sweet music. The crowd cheered again and dispersed. Knowing ones claim that Vance will certainly carry the State by at least 15,000 majority.
