WEATHER REPORT.

INDICATIONS FOR TO-DAY.—For the Middle Atlantic States, partly cloudy weather, with a light rain, warm south-westerly veering to colder north-west winds, rising barometer.

For the South Atlantic States, increasing cloudiness, rain areas, southerly winds, stationary temperature and stationary or lower barometer.

For the Gulf States, cloudy, rainy weather, warm southerly winds, followed by rising barometer and colder northeast or northerly winds, and in the western district by clearing weather.

For the Pacific States, and the Ohio Valley, cloudy weather and rain areas, followed by clearing weather, colder northerly winds, and rising barometer.

Cautionary signals continue at Cape May, Atlantic City, Barnegat, Sandy Hook, and other points for New Jersey, New York, Portland, Boston, Thatchers Island, Wood's Hole, Eastport.
