Terrible Tornado at Canton. FRANKFORD LOSS OF LIFE—TEN THOUSAND PERSONS KILLED.—The consul at Canton reports to the Department of State at Washington that a terrible tornado passed over that city on the 11th of April last, causing great destruction of life and property. The whirlwind came from the east and destroyed the foreign settlement of Shanghai, passing thence in a northeasterly direction through the crowded part of the city of Canton. The average breadth of the track left by the tornado is six hundred feet. Although many houses were destroyed, and the cases of miraculous escape from death were numerous. The United States consulate was just beyond the track of the storm, and no American property was damaged. In the native city it is estimated that 10,000 persons were killed. Owing to the narrowness of the streets, the work of removing the dead bodies from the wreck made slow progress, and would take several weeks to accomplish. The weather was very hot, and the fearful stench from decomposing bodies led many to fear the outbreak of a pestilence.

A VENTURESOME VOYAGE.—Boston, Mass., June 10.—William A. and Walter Adams, brothers, left this port yesterday for Havre, France, in the Nautilus, the smallest vessel that ever attempted to cross the ocean. The boat has water and provisions for sixty days, and although the brothers expect to make Havre in about forty-five days, the craft is ninety-nine inches long, and six feet four inches beam.
