Death of Mr. Hobbs.—Mr. William H. Hobbs, a well-known citizen of this place, died at his home in Richmond, on Sunday morning at 5 o'clock, in the thirty-fifth year of his age.

George Lewis Desires to be Executed.—The records of the trial of George Lewis, an attorney, murderer, who was sentenced to be executed on the 25th day of the present month, are in the possession of the counsel for the condemned murderer, who will present them before Judge Taylor of the Circuit Court in Richmond, in an effort to procure a stay of sentence and to obtain a new trial, chiefly claiming that the evidence before the County Court was insufficient to sustain the verdict.

The clergyman conversed with him upon the subject of religion for some time, and endeavored to impress upon him the great necessity and importance of religion, but as yet he has not succeeded in converting him. After a lengthy conversation with the prisoner, and having heard that he had confessed his guilt to several parties, the question was asked by the minister, what could have induced him to commit such a horrible and atrocious crime.

At times the unfortunate man converses freely upon the subject of religion, but again he is frequently unconcerned about the inevitable fate which awaits him. His brother visited him several days ago, upon leaving he was told farewell by the lawyer who asked him, "What is the name of your great friend and benefactor, if he is coming down on the 25th, the day of the execution. He eats heartily and is looking quite well. Upon leaving, the minister who has labored and prayed so earnestly for the poor, unfortunate man, requested Lewis to write a few lines for him, belonging to the preacher, and in a plain, legible hand he wrote "Geo. Lewis," and beneath the name he also added, "And wishes to die in Christ."

A Liberal Donation.—A collection was taken up Sunday at the colored Baptist church of this city for funds for the remodeling of that church, and it amounted to \$100. Under the ministry of Rev. A. Binz, Jr., the membership has greatly increased, and at present the capacity of the church is insufficient to accommodate the entire membership of the church.

Sunday School.—There was quite a large attendance at the colored Baptist Sunday school on the occasion of the organization of a Sunday school. The number of scholars enrolled was forty-four. Mr. Bladen was elected superintendent.
