The law passed last winter for refunding the State debt provided that if the Council of Foreign Bondholders and the Funding Association of the United States should before the 1st day of May, 1878, file with the Governor their assent to the act, and should fund eight millions of dollars of the debt prior to the 1st day of January, 1880, a contract should thereupon arise between the State and those corporations under which they should have a right to fund the entire debt of the State according to the terms and provisions of that act.
