A BASTARD IN BOSTON FATALLY STABBED—
THE MURDERER CAPTURED.

Boston, August 3.—A serious and probably a fatal stabbing affray occurred in the saloon of Denis F. McGarry, No. 70 Kingston street, on Saturday night, the victim being Jeremiah Slisk, a bar-tender. Shortly after 10 o'clock Officers Grady and Clark, of the Fourth division, had their attention called to one David Slisk, who was considerably under the influence of liquor and was acting in a very disorderly manner. They followed him down the street a short distance, when he succeeded in getting away. Some time afterward they were informed by a man who was coming down the street that there had been a stabbing affray in the saloon of McGarry. A visit to that place revealed to them that Jeremiah Slisk, the bartender, had been killed by David Slisk, once in the abdomen and once in the leg.

From Slisk, who was sitting in an armchair when the officers entered, it was learned that at about half-past 11 o'clock of shortly afterward Slisk entered the saloon and demanded a drink of beer. Some half hour followed, provoked by Slisk, whereupon Slisk ordered him out of the saloon. He was followed, when Slisk took a large revolver from his pocket and stabbed his unarmed opponent twice. The blade, which was about four inches in length, entered the lower part of the abdomen, inflicting a wound about two inches in length and half an inch deep, from which the blood flowed. Not satisfied with his dastardly attack, Slisk, who seemed to be maddened by the sight of the blood which poured in torrents from the wound, withdrew the knife and made another vicious lunge, inflicting a severe cut in the fleshy part of the left leg. A man by the name of William Foley, who was in the saloon at the time, witnessed the assault, sprang forward to rescue the bar-tender from his perilous position, whereupon Slisk dropped the knife and fled.

Short was taken in a carriage to the City Hospital, where he was lying in a precarious condition at an early hour this morning. The would-be murderer is forty-seven years of age. Short is about thirty years of age, and lives with his wife at No. 10 Edinborough street. He has always borne an unexceptionable reputation.

HEAVY STORM—LOSS OF LIVE STOCK AND DAMAGE TO CROPS.

LONDON, August 4.—A storm of extraordinary severity in the valley of the Thames and other parts in England Saturday night caused immense injury to growing crops. The damage by rain, hail, and inundation will be irreparable this season. The loss of live stock is serious.

FURTHER PARTICULARS.
LONDON, August 4.—The severe storm known here for several days, raged in various parts of England, and especially in the valley of the Thames, on Saturday night. The storm was attended by a fall of hailstones, some of which were five inches in circumference. The damage to glass on places immediately around London amounts to several thousands of pounds sterling. In a great part of Bedfordshire the hay crop has been completely swept away and many cattle drowned. Newmarket and neighborhood are flooded. The rainfall in Buckinghamshire is estimated at seventy tons per acre. Damages by floods and lightning are also reported from Cambridge, Norfolk, Guildford, Leicester, Bath, and Monmouth.
