Among the first greetings that I received in New York was that of Edwin Booth. After a brief conversation I asked him his estimate of Henry Irving as an actor of the English stage. My subsequent experiences of Mr. Irving confirmed Mr. Booth's opinion. I first saw Irving as Shylock in the Merchant of Venice. To me the play has never been a pleasing one for the stage. Its action is slow, it is deficient in strong dramatic situations, and gives a great actor in the impersonation of Shylock few opportunities for illustrating intense dramatic power. It is, however, a play which, if acted with skill, is a masterpiece of dramatic art.
