Private telegrams from Chicago show Blaine's chances good.

The Daily Telegram, Fergus Falls, has been reduced from a seven column folio to a six column folio, and otherwise much improved.

It seems there was a late combination made at Washington to try to nominate Gen. Sherman, when the general promptly telegraphed that he would not accept the nomination if tendered, nor serve if elected.

Lawyer Gillilan, we believe of St. Paul, has been nominated for congress in the fourth district of Minnesota, by the republicans. This district contains St. Paul and Minneapolis, and was closely contested. The outcome is considered a victory for the people, as against the Sabin ring, and is consequently right. Washburn "must go" now, sure!

There is an immense flood of humanity at Chicago, especially about the convention hall, and seats are rated at fancy prices, desirable ones being sold for \$50. The latest reports seem to indicate that Arthur's goose is cooked, and that Blaine is thoroughly able to hold his own, and possibly win in the end. But of course sell-outs and breakers may be looked for.

Sternor, who killed Mutschler, a saloon keeper, in an Ottertail county town a few months since, in a fight which grew out of the fact that Mutschler threatened to burn down the town in case a new board of aldermen raised the liquor license, is now on trial at Fergus. This case created a great deal of excitement all over the county, and is attracting a good deal of attention there now.

The Codington County Democrat, an eight column patent Democratic newspaper has been started at Watertown, this territory. George A. Edes is the editor and manager. The paper is well gotten up and has the very best wishes of THE TIMES. If this is the Mr. Edes whom THE TIMES (in embryo—away back) used to know in the Tribune job rooms, Minneapolis, just shake your head, and if it isn't—don't, that's all.

We notice by the Telegram that Fergus Falls is disposed to kick because its traveling citizens are usually unable to secure "lower berths" on the Manitoba sleepers. They propose to speak to Manager Manvel and have a section or two saved for that town, as the train comes from Fargo. As there are other towns along the route, we presume Mr. Manvel will consider that Fergus is located in the wrong place.

It is announced that A. C. and J. J. Jordan have leased the Fargo Republican. We have known these gentlemen for a dozen years. They are not only great workers, but understand the business from the beginning to the end, and will sift matters about the Republican institution in a very judicious manner, and will soon place the same upon a safe and business like basis. They will know what is coming in and what is going out as well as sizing up the public, and will then push the paper just as fast as the circumstances will admit. It was a good day's work for Fargo and the Fargo newspaper field when these intelligent and practical newspaper men took thus charge of the Republican. Fargo Dep't Globe: It is understood that Col. Plummer is released from duty on the Republican since the lease by the Jordans. It has been spreading out too broadly for financial advantage in these times.

Argus: J.C. Hennis of Fairmont, Dakota, arrived in Fargo last evening on business. He is proprietor of the townsite of Fairmount, which is one of the best located of the new towns on the Fargo Southern, and is the centre of a very attractive region.

Globe: There is quite a number among the younger classes at Wahpeton over the opening of the new roller rink. The place is beautifully lighted and the cornet band adds to the attractions. The youth and beauty, for which especially the place claims an unusual share, through the place evenings and have merry times.

Fargo Dep't Globe: The G. A. R. post at Wahpeton, under command of Col. Gregg, held a very successful memorial exercise on the 30th, the schools, societies and fire department joining in the procession. The opera house was filled and all the features were appropriate. Maj. G. B. Barnes delivered the memorial address. There are several privates in this post.

The Woman's Christian Temperance Union, Fergus Falls, paid the Spanish students \$200 to play at that place Friday evening of last week, and came out \$15 short. These dark-eyed, strong featured individuals are everywhere spoken of as giving an admirable musical entertainment. We happened to travel 100 miles with the company last week, stopped at the same hotel, &c., and they are a wonderful people, very attractive, full of fun among themselves, and fit subjects for study. They are in the west on a prospecting tour; it ending at Grand Forks this week.

General Passenger Agent Warner, of the Manitoba railroad, attended the Theopian performance last evening, and after seeing Barnes in two or three scenes, said to a Fargo gentleman: "You ought to put Barnes on the stage; he's too good an actor to stay in a watchmaker's shop." The audience generally seemed to think about the same way.—[Argus.]

We believe that the Mr. Barnes here mentioned is a brother of Wahpeton's Rev. George B., and under the circumstances it would seem that acting, to a certain extent at least, is a characteristic of the family. The reverend gentleman imparts to his excellent sermons much of interest through modest though firm acting.

Important Meeting.
At a meeting to consider the road question and the propriety of celebrating the Fourth, A. J. Goodhue was made chairman, and Chas. Damerel secretary, and in the former case John Nelson and A. L. Roberts were appointed to assist Freeman Orcutt in soliciting money by subscription to apply on roads leading into Wahpeton, that gentleman having already obtained by subscription \$300 for the purpose. And J. W. Blanding, J. W. Hayward, A. W. Harwood, A. Miksche and J. Cargill were made a committee to view the several routes leading to town and direct where and the best way to expend such money as collected. It was thought best to have no celebration, but to put all the money possible into the roads. This was a proper meeting and its deliberations were to the point. The Wahpeton grader will become useful in this work.

Pembina will celebrate the Fourth of July in great style.

Gov. Ordway is at Sioux Falls preparing materials for an onslaught on the United States district attorney and his other enemies.

About one-half the corn raised in Southeastern Dakota during last season has been shipped to Illinois, Iowa and Minnesota for seed.

J. C. Ryan, serving a term for petit larceny, and Thomas Ward, for grand larceny, escaped from the Mitchell jail Monday night while both the watchmen were asleep at their posts.

Dakota Sun: Watertown is having a boom over the fact that two ends of the Rock Island road are to meet at that point and make a division with machine shops, etc. The whole line is under contract, and the road is to be completed by fall.

One man in Turner county claims to have killed over 800 wolves this season, selling the skins to traders and scalps yielding bounty. He says he runs them out to their lairs with hounds and digs them out making \$800 a month. He is believed to put a good deal of ozone into his stories.
