There is an exceptionally strong basis as the theme of the production—a novel which is both vital and timely, from an author whose books have already proved themselves admirably adapted for screen interpretation. The cast, the scenario, the director, everything in fact, that comprises a component part of film manufacture have had one object—the best possible delineation of Dixon's story as he wrote it and as the public wants to see it. Each person in the important roles of this picture has at some time been starred or featured in a big production.

The atmosphere is tense and vibrant with the jangling, discordant note, the misery, injustice, cruelty and hopelessness of the life of the metropolis. There are few scenes in fiction more enthralling than that in which Gordon breaks the news of his new love to his wife, and in which they part. Into these are embodied all the pitiful horror of the crumbling household gods—the breaking heart of the wife—the wondering and loving innocence of the children—the enmeshment, vulgarity and brutality of the man with a flame for another woman. The photoplay version of "The One Woman" has been prepared under the personal supervision of Mr. Dixon who has insisted upon the action of the novel being closely adhered to.

DOUGLAS FAIRBANKS IN "ARIZONA" AT SEXTON AGAIN TODAY AND TOMORROW.

Hundreds who thronged the ticket office at the Sexton last night to see Douglas Fairbanks in "Arizona" were turned away, but the play will be shown again today and tomorrow.

"The Mystery Girl," an adaptation of George Barr McCutcheon's "Green Fanny," will be at the Sexton Tuesday and Wednesday. This is a Paramount picture starring Ethel Clayton.

Like so many of McCutcheon's stories it has to do with an imaginary kingdom called Laurana. The story is modern, the early scenes taking place in France on the west front, where the heroine, Princess "Ted," is an ambulance driver. There a young American army captain meets her, and later when the princess comes to America to meet her uncle, whom the Germans have driven from his kingdom, the captain, who has been ordered home because of temporary disability, is brought in closer touch with the Princess, winning her love, and both return to the battlefields of France. The story was adapted for the screen by Marion Fairfax.

"String Beans," a Thomas H. Ince Paramount photoplay, in which Charles Ray appears as a country boy, will be at the Sexton Thursday and Friday.

Salary Cut Suffered by County Officers

Helena, Jan. 11.—Salaries of a number of county officers are cut by a law which has just gone into effect, regarding reclassification of counties. Fergus, Lewis and Clark and Yellowstone office holders are the sufferers.

Under the new act, a county with an assessed valuation of more than \$50,000,000 is first class. Silver Bow, which contains Butte, alone comes under this category. Second-class counties must have \$30,000,000, and the three counties mentioned, falling short of that figure, fell into the third class, with consequent reduction of pay. The new law adds

\$10,000,000 to the old figures in each class. Sheriffs are not affected. The cut on other officers is about \$250 per annum each. Treasurers and county attorneys also are to receive the same pay.

SUES FOR LOSS OF CATTLE.
