Industrial Review

Butte—The Anaconda Copper Mining company has gone showing for the year 1918. Copper, 298,000,000 pounds; zinc, 74,700,000 pounds; silver, 10,700,000 ounces; gold, 41,500 ounces.

The total value of Montana's crops for 1918 was \$146,713,000, against \$106,745,000 for 1917.

Whitefish made substantial growth in population in 1918; no unemployed. Great Falls—Formation of new Montana Woolgrowers' association is expected.

Ronan—Flathead reservation wants a new treaty form.

Chouteau—Unusually large amount of livestock sold, due to shortage of feed. Custer—Larger acreage winter wheat and rye seeded than in previous years.

Valley ranches sell 2-year-olds for \$125.50 each and yearlings for \$100 each. All the animals were strictly grass-fed, and were kept throughout the season on irrigated pastures; they were high-grade shortbreds.

Broadwater—Fall plowing and seeding below normal, due to labor shortage. Montana's metal output for 1918 showed an increase of about \$12,000.

Plentywood—Sheridan county is the most important center of production of pure, pedigreed flax seed of variety best adapted to Montana.
