ALL SOLDIERS AND SAILORS TO ATTEND

Men Who Have Returned From Military Duty Urged to Be Present in Palm Room of Hotel Rainbow on Sunday Afternoon at 3.

There is going to be a meeting of returned soldiers and sailors at the palm room of Hotel Rainbow on Sunday afternoon. The purpose is to discuss plans for effecting some sort of an organization that may be of help to such of the returned and returning soldiers as may be required and in other ways to assist in any manner possible in handling the problem of getting the boys who are returning from the training camps by the front in France, back to employment in civilian life. Steps already have been taken to handle this and yesterday W. H. Hoover, who recently returned from a training camp, gave out the following which outlines the plans for the meeting on Sunday:

"The time has come for the discharged soldiers of the army and navy in and about Great Falls to get together. There are between 150 and 200 of us in Great Falls at the present time. Some have returned to their own homes, some have returned to their business positions and occupations and some have come to Great Falls in search of employment.

"The business conditions in Great Falls are such that it is difficult for some of us to get properly placed. Those who have returned to their homes and established positions feel toward all the soldiers and sailors that same feeling of fellowship and friendliness which existed during our various periods of service. We want an opportunity to get acquainted. We all want to know every soldier and sailor in Great Falls. There is only one way to do this and that is by a general meeting. At such a meeting we can organize ourselves for the purpose of getting acquainted, and wherever it is necessary, lending such assistance and aid to any soldier and sailor that his circumstances may require.

"We know that we have behind us the full support of a patriotic and grateful community and that what we need to do is to unify ourselves so that our needs and requirements may become known and met.

"There is no doubt that during the next few months a great many more boys will be coming here. I am sure that Great Falls wants them to come and that Great Falls will be able to accommodate them all.

"Our organization, then, should be of a permanent nature to meet the requirements of the immediate future as well as the present.

"There is going to be a big meeting for soldiers and sailors only at the palm room of Hotel Rainbow on Sunday afternoon at 3. That is the place for every boy who has come back to give us his ideas and to hear what the other fellows have to say.

"We propose to confine this meeting and this organization to fellows who

have been in the service, for several reasons. We can talk things over better among ourselves. We know each other better for having been in the service, and we know our needs and our desires. "I certainly hope that no soldier or sailor in Great Falls or about Great Falls will miss this meeting. It is going to be a real affair and it is likely to have important consequences for all who attend and for those who will be coming back later."
