PETITION STARTS IRRIGATION DISTRICT PROJECT AT CHINOOK

Special to The Daily Tribune. Harlem, Feb. 22.—The irrigation committee held a meeting in Chinook Wednesday and made arrangements to file the petition in the district court this coming week asking that the irrigation district be created.

A majority of the landowners, representing also the majority of the acreage, is represented on the petition.

The court will cause notice to be published for four weeks, notifying all the landowners of the intention to create this irrigation district, and will also specify a time when those opposed might appear before the district court and enter their objections.

OPHEIM WANTS SOO TO RUN R. R. SPUR TO GROWING TOWN

Farmers at Present Have to Haul Wheat 60 Miles to Reach Market.

Plentywood, Feb. 22.—As the war has ended, citizens at Opeheim, a town 60 miles inland in the north end of Valley county, are making an effort to get the Soo line extended there from Whitehall, a town situated at the terminus of the Soo in the northwestern corner of Sheldahl county.

Opeheim is a town of 1,000 people, is equipped with electric lights, cement sidewalks, two newspapers, two moving picture theaters, and is located in the center of a prosperous grain-producing territory, but without a railroad the farmers in that vicinity are compelled to haul their wheat overland to either Scooby or Glasgow, more than 60 miles in either direction, to reach a market.

Kalispell, Feb. 22.—Joe and Frank Santrosa, Italians from Whitefish, were arrested by Sheriff Martin on a charge of highway robbery preferred by Rocco Labellario, a fellow countryman.
