CHICAGO MARKET
GRAIN AND PROVISIONS.
Chicago, March 24.—Export purchases of wheat the first day of the week made in some time, lifted the market today to new high levels for the season. Closing prices, however, were unchanged. Oats gained 1/4 to 3/8c. The result in provisions was a general advance. At first the corn market showed considerable weakness, owing to larger receipts and fine weather that promised to make the movement continue more liberal than has been the rule of late. Another bearish factor was the current report that the government was to let go of much rye and barley. Then word began to circulate that export demand for corn had resulted in actual business here amounting to upward of 150,000 bushels and that additional foreign buying was in prospect.
